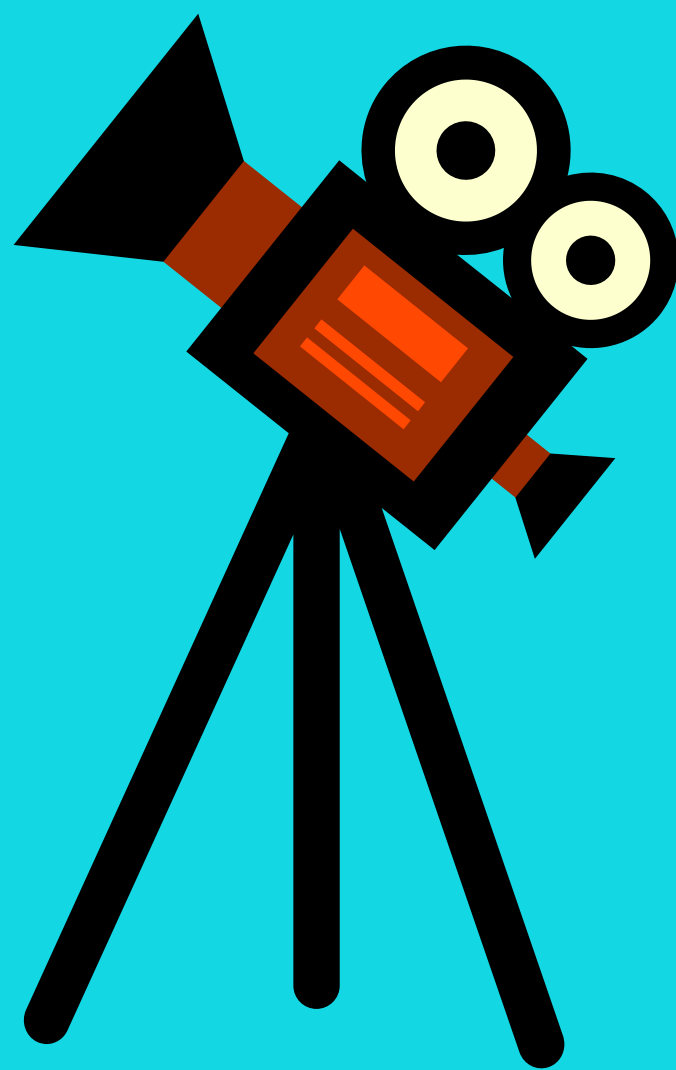


PSYCHOLOGICAL SAFETY ON SET

PREVENT HARM

The easiest way to stay safe is to prevent harm before it happens.



IDENTIFY RISKS AND SOLUTIONS

Think about how conditions, behaviours, and situations on set might make some cast and crew members feel unsafe or unwelcome. How can we change this? How might people experience set differently?

KNOW WHAT'S EXPECTED

Review the production's Code of Conduct. Find ways to encourage welcoming behaviours and situations.



EXPLORE TRAINING

Visit Screen Access Alberta's website for training and resources about how to promote equity and inclusion on set.

PROMOTE SAFETY

Everyone on set can encourage and participate in building a psychologically safe place to work.

PROTECT ONE ANOTHER

Watch for psychological safety hazards that could affect people on set differently. Report concerns to the production's Culture Safety Officer.
